- City’s Park Operations website created in 2006 including both operational and home owner information sections
- Working together, Communities in Bloom, City Parks Department & volunteers create new and revamp old flower beds through the “Adopt a Park” program and other requests.
- Parks Improvement funding of \$25,000 annually available to neighbourhoods for parks improvements (maximum of \$5000 annually)
- 32 km of existing paved trails maintained Transportation
- new being added in new developments – this does not include natural gravel trails.
- Muskoseepi Park has 17 km of trail throughout Muskoseepi Park
- Recreation maps include trails and connecting sidewalks, parks and major green spaces, recreation and culture facilities and arbour groves
- This map available on the city website in Parks facilities

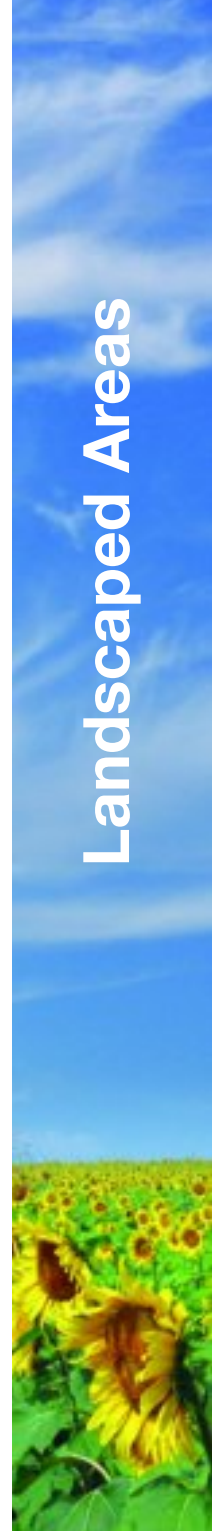
