Are there particular efforts and/or issues that you would like to highlight for this reporting period related to your community's work to achieve the Reaching Home minimum requirements? In particular, please describe your community's efforts to set-up or improve the Coordinated Access governance structure, including processes to ensure that policies and protocols, as approved by the governance group(s), are being implemented across the system as intended to achieve desired results.

1) Grande Prairie hired a consultant in late 2019 to assist with development of a system of Coordinated Access for the homeless sector. The consulting team produced a set of guiding and policy documents that compliment our existing standards of practice. Approval of policies and protocols is currently achieved through consensus-based meetings with leads from all homeless sector organizations participating in the Coordinated Access initiative. The City stakes the lead in developing and proposing new documentation or changes, as well as on collecting regular feedback on process to identify opportunities for improvement. Our Coordinated Access system also goes beyond the homeless sector, through a partnership with the local Family and Community Support Services and the County of Grande Prairie. This partnership is looking at extending the efficiencies of the homeless sector approach across the social sector in Grande Prairie and surrounding rural areas. Governance for this portion of Coordinated Access is currently under development. 2) The new Coordinated Access process within the homeless sector has allowed for more inclusion of people experiencing chronic homelessness in Housing First programs, as well as more effective customized care plans for people experiencing chronic homelessness that involve other programs, health services, etc. This approach, coupled with upcoming availability of more supportive housing will help us to reduce chronic homelessness in Grande Prairie.








