

Parking in Residential Areas

Follow these guidelines to help the City clear residential roads safely, quickly and with a reduced chance for damage to property. No Parking:



If there is a windrow in the parking lane.



On residential roads, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the assigned plowing day, or when signs indicate.



On Priority 2 roads and permanent snow routes when a parking ban is in effect.

Snow Storage

On Priority 1 roads, snow is plowed past the curb and stored on City owned boulevards. On Priority 2 roads, snow is windrowed to the center and removed at a later date. Depending on the specific location, snow on residential roads will be:



Plowed to the side of the road without a sidewalk and pushed past the curb and stored on the City boulevard when there is a sidewalk on one side of the road.



Stored on the side of the road in windrows or pushed past the curb and stored on the City boulevard when there is sidewalk on both sides of the road.



Piled and stored in the centre of cul-de-sacs.

Sidewalk Shovelling

Residents are responsible for removing snow or ice from sidewalks lining a property within 24 hours of the most recent snowfall. Snow removed from sidewalks, driveways, parking lots and private lanes cannot be placed on City property or on the road right-of-way, including ditches.

Lawn Ornaments and Plants

To protect your lawn ornaments, shrubs, trees or other decorations, it is recommended these be placed towards the back of your lawn. Depending on a property's location, the City-owned boulevard where snow is stored can be as much as 4 metres back from the curb.

The City of Grande Prairie maintains three types of roads in the winter:

1. Priority 1, 2 and 3 roads
2. Residential
3. Rural

Priority-Road Snow Clearing

City crews monitor, plow, windrow, sand and salt Priority 1, 2 and 3 roads.

Priority 1 roads are cleared first to make safe way for fire trucks, ambulances, other essential services and residents. Priority 2 and 3 routes are cleared after Priority 1 routes are complete.

Residential Snow Clearing

The City hires contracted crews to plow neighbourhood roads and paved alleyways. Residential clearing is triggered when declared by the City and occurs:



From Monday to Friday.



From 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.



In 2-week rotations.

Week A and Week B

The City has assigned neighbourhoods to a "Week A" and "Week B" schedule when residential snow clearing is declared.

When a round of residential snow removal is declared by the City, crews will clear all residential roads (Week A and Week B) within a two-week rotation.
